Will our choices reflect the promise and hope of the Risen Christ?

A Land Acknowledgement expresses how we relate to creation and our Indigenous neighbours. It describes the physical space we inhabit and it recognizes the treaty responsibilities our ancestors have agreed upon. It also names the peoples who have cared for this territory for many generations.

Important Information for today's worship
