



Important Lift Reminder: Please remember to always "park" the lift part way between floors after use. This will ensure it is always ready to be called to any level where it is needed. Parking the lift at the bottom (at the main level) or up at the sanctuary level can cause it to stall and become inoperable. Thank you very much!

West Tower Door for Emergency Only. Due to the ongoing construction planning, when going in to the church house or lower level washrooms, use the west stair tower door and stay on that floor. Use the hallway by the office to the stairway to the floor below. The stairs in the west tower are closed to the lower level sanctuary and should only be used in case of an emergency to exit the building.
