2023 Tithe Recipients: This is the second year that St. Matthews has tithed a generous amount of money from the December 2021 sale of the 39 and 51 Church St. properties. In March of 2023 the Tithe Taskforce, (Jim Treusch, Lynda Karn, Sylvia McLeod, Tim Schaner) was established to brainstorm and generate a list of possible candidates to receive a monetary gift, which was narrowed down to six candidates. Each of the candidates fell into one or more of the categories that align with St. Matthews' mission and vision, which are: Indigenous Charities, Wider Church (Locally/Globally), Children/focus on programs for development for the future, Caring for the Marginalized and Caring for Seniors.

After careful, thoughtful consideration, St. Matthews is pleased to announce the recipients of the 2023 Tithe installment. The list below is in no particular order of importance.

- The Working Centre Caring for the Marginalized Support programs run by the Working Centre: \$50,000
