Music note: The set of 8 little prelude and fugue organ miniatures were previously attributed to J.S. Bach, however more recent scholarship suggests that they were more likely composed by one or several of his students. William Byrd composed the Pavan for keyboard, reportedly dedicating it to the Earl of Salisbury. William David Young arranged the text which the choir will sing as the anthem using verses of Psalm 84.

Important Information for today's worship

- Masks: According to the Waterloo Region Bylaw, wearing a mask indoors is mandatory.
