Important Information for today's worship

- Masks: According to our church's current protocols, wearing a mask indoors is mandatory.
- **Personal belongings:** You may use the basement coat racks, but please use the Church Street side staircase to descend back down (follow the arrows). Please still exit via the left (Charles St.) staircase and doors.
- . Offering: Please place your offering in one of the offering plates upon leaving.
