All are welcome at the meal where Jesus is present loving you and forgiving you. The pastor will distribute communion wafers using tongs. Gluten-free wafers are also available; please indicate this request to the Pastor. You may then take a pre-poured wine cup from the larger tray or a juice cup from the smaller tray. If you would (also) like to receive a blessing, please approach the Pastor with your arms crossed over your chest. If you'd like to receive Communion in your pew, the pastor will come to you. Please let an usher or the pastor know before worship if possible.

# Important Information for today's worship

- **Self-Screening:** Members are reminded to continue to perform self-assessments if they have COVID symptoms.
- **Masks:** We support people's choice to wear a mask, and we strongly encourage the following of current guidelines.
- **Physical distancing:** Members are encouraged to continue physical distancing where possible indoors.
- Offering: Please place your offering in one of the offering plates in the Narthex (entranceway) upon entering. The offering plates will be presented to the High Altar during the service.
- **The Peace:** We support people's choices for passing of the peace.
- **Exiting:** At the end of the service, please remain in place until the end of the postlude.
- **Ministers** will be greeting worshippers after the postlude in the Narthex, without handshakes.
- Thank you for helping to keep all of us as safe as possible during this pandemic, by following these directions!

#### Are you new here?

We're so glad that you joined us for worship today!

-Page numbers in the Evangelical Lutheran Worship (red hymnal), e.g. marked "p.125", are located at the bottom of the page in the front section of the book. Hymn numbers are the large numbers at the top of the page in the second half of the book.

-*Washrooms*: use the west stair tower door (closest to the piano) and stay on that floor. Use the hallway by the office to the stairway to the floor below. The men's washroom is to your immediate left, and the women's is behind you to your left.

*-Safety*: Our building monitor patrols the building to ensure security on Sunday mornings. Their cell number is found under "Leading Worship Today".

-Accessibility: Accessible on-street parking is available beside the church along Church St. Our marked accessible entrance is on Church Street, with a lift up to the sanctuary level. Two spots (labeled "For Accessible Needs") are also available in our main parking lot nearest the Office Entrance. Our accessible washroom is located beside our Fellowship Hall (off the entranceway on the Church St. side). Unfortunately, to currently reach the Fellowship Hall or this washroom without using stairs, you must use the lift and then exit the building and proceed via the sidewalk down to the Fellowship Hall doors (with the alcove).

- *Fellowship Hall Coffee Hour following the service:* To get there, use the west stair tower door (closest to the piano) and stay on that floor. Use the hallway by the office to the stairway to the floor below. Turn left and then immediately right down the hallway.

## **General Announcements**

**Update: West Tower Door for Emergency Only.** Due to the current demolition, when going in to the church house or washrooms, use the west stair tower door and stay on that floor. Use the hallway by the office to the stairway to the floor below. The stairs in the west tower are closed to the lower level sanctuary and should only be used in case of an emergency to exit the building.

**Dear Congregation Members,** We thank you for your patience with the broken phone system. We have signed on with a new phone provider and we are currently going through the on-boarding processes and we hope to have the system up and running in the next 2 - 3 weeks barring any issues along the way. **Fire Exits:** All Sanctuary fire exits remain operational during lowerlevel demolition and renovations. This includes the three Narthex (Entrance) doors, the mid-tower door (half-way up the right side), and the staircase at the front left, piano side.

**Church Fire Plan:** For everyone's awareness, a copy of the Church Fire Plan for safe exit from the Sanctuary appears in the back of the worship books. Please take a moment to review for your own safety.
