


## **General Announcements**

West Tower Door for Emergency Only. Due to the ongoing construction planning, when going in to the church house or washrooms, use the west stair tower door and stay on that floor. The stairs in the west tower are closed to the lower level sanctuary and should only be used in case of an emergency to exit the building.
