About the Seven Sacred Teachings

We seek to walk in a good way with our Indigenous neighbours. One thing we can do as faith communities is learn about Indigenous spiritual practices and honour them. Canada's Truth and Reconciliation Commission Call to Action # 60 asks us to do this work, individually and together.

"The teachings in Ojibwe (Anishinaabe) cultures have been traditionally passed down from generation to generation orally through stories and ceremonies. Historically, this was done by the elders who carry the stories and traditions. Today the oral traditions are being shared by those who carry the knowledge of such things. The teachings of all Indigenous cultures encompass the morals, values, structures, ceremonial practices, and spiritual beliefs of the group. These teachings also ensured the survival of the people. The teachings vary from nation to nation, because of the geographical placement of each particular group. However, the sacred teachings commonly come from the same root and share a similar message."

Of all the North American Indigenous teachings, the Seven Sacred Teachings, also known as Seven Grandfather or Seven Grandmother Teachings, are the most commonly shared from coast to coast. Many Indigenous organizations and communities have adopted the seven guiding principles, in one form or another, as a moral stepping stone and cultural foundation. Each community has adapted the teachings to suit their community values. Despite where the teachings may have originated, they share the same concepts of abiding by a moral respect for all living things.



About the Fourth Teaching: Honesty (Raven or Sabe)

Honesty is represented by either the raven or the sabe. They both understand who they are and how to walk in their life. "Sabe reminds us to be ourselves and not someone we are not. An honest person is said to walk tall like Kitchi-Sabe... Like Kitchi -Sabe, Raven accepts himself and knows how to use his gift. He does not seek the power, speed or beauty of others. He uses what he has been given to survive and thrive. So must you."

- Offering: Please place your offering in one of the offering plates in the Narthex (entranceway) upon entering. The offering plates will be presented at the High Altar during the service.

A further all-gender washroom is also available via the west stair tower door (front left of the Sanctuary) on the same level. Turn right at the hallway.

Proposed New Bylaws Congregational Meeting on September 22

For over two years, the Bylaw task force has been preparing for the new Ontario Notfor-Profit Corporations Act (ONCA) which comes into effect on October 18, 2024. In consultation with the 2023 Eastern Synod Model Constitution and Synod Secretary Grahlman, the task force has proposed new Articles of Amendment (which amend the Letters of Patent) as well as an updated Bylaw No 1 and No. 2. Upon recommendation of the Board, these will be presented to the congregation at a special first meeting on Sunday September 22 following the worship service (a second meeting for ratification would follow on October 27, as per our current bylaws).

Many changes were required by ONCA, many more proposed by Synod, and dozens of smaller changes were made, so instead of presenting each change individually, the bylaws will be presented in their entirety as updated documents for approval. At the September meeting, amendments to the updated documents can be proposed from the membership.

A two-page summary document of major changes will be distributed to the congregation, along with the current and proposed bylaws, starting September 1st. We invite any questions or concerns to be directed before the meeting to John Heil, Kim Schaner or Pastor Sebastian.

The most important changes are as follows:

- A reduction of the required number of Board members from 19 to a range of 3 to 10, with a suggestion of 7 to 10.
- 2. A clarification that there are (only) two distinct classes of members: voting and non-voting
- 3. The removal of the right to vote by proxy (as it is no longer required by ONCA)
- 4. Written notice (mail/email) to all voting members of all congregational meetings will be required, replacing the requirement for an advertisement in the Waterloo
- 14 Record.
