Joseph has often been cast as a kind of third wheel in the nativity story, a man standing at the periphery of a scene firmly centered on Mary and her child. Yet it's good to see him as more than merely Mary's husband. Joseph's "yes" is therefore not incidental. His decision shielded Mary from shame and perhaps even from the danger that would likely befall a dishonoured woman and her family. Far from peripheral, Joseph's "yes" is absolutely essential to God's unfolding story.
