Confession and Forgiveness

L: God of all grace, be near in the midst of our brokenness,

turning us from the things that keep us from right relationship with you, ourselves, and one another.

Compel us toward compassion as we confess our sin, receive your forgiveness, and are strengthened to serve in your name.

A: Amen.

L: Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.

A: God of mercy, you delight in goodness and judge sin. Give us open and honest hearts to recognize the ways we have turned from you, from our own belovedness, and from one another. We see the world through the lens of scarcity instead of your lens of abundance. We see people as us and them instead of one body in you.

We participate in the brokenness of the world, caught in webs beyond individual choices of right and wrong. Quiet our inner and outer strife, O God, and draw us into your forgiveness and wholeness. Through your divine love, transform all that threatens to destroy the good that you have created.

L: Beloved people of God: At a table that Jesus sets, God forgives us and feeds us with love eternal. In water and promise, God brings us to new life and breathes into us gifts to serve the world. You are forgiven, in the name of Christ (+), who calls us into the coming of God's reign where all are supported, nourished, and loved. A: Amen.

Spiritual Discernment on the Election of a New National Bishop - At the 2025 ELCIC National Convention, delegates will elect a new National Bishop. The ELCIC's National Church Council invites members into a discernment process leading up to the election.

Road Work Benton (Charles- Courtland) Gas Main Replacement: Road paving by the Region of Waterloo and replace natural gas main. Work will begin on or about March 24, 2025 (weather permitting) and will take approximately 2 - 3 months to complete. **The following site access and traffic restrictions will apply during construction:**

- March 24 April 4 work in the laneway and backyard of 22-38 Courtland Ave. E.
- March 31 April 16 Road Closure of Benton from Courtland to St. George, local traffic only and no parking on the east side of Benton. No access to Benton north-bound from Courtland and no left turns onto Benton southbound from Courtland.
- April 16 June 13 NorthbouOnd right lane closed on Benton from Courtland to Charles. No parking on the east side of Benton from Courtland to St. George St.
