Worship Notes

In our prayers Kevin, Betty, George, Anneke, Judy, Clare, Yvonne, Jeanette, Meaghan, Henry, Maureen and John.

Today's prayers and passion narrative will be enhanced by meditative breaks using the Japanese Zen Buddhist Shakuhachi. The shakuhachi is a monastic instrument that travelled with esoteric Buddhism from China to Japan between the 7th the 8th centuries. Dr. Gerard Yun brings the contemplative aesthetics of traditional Zen *honkyoku* (meditation music) into conversation with the Good Friday liturgy. The bamboo instru-

ment is designed to play music called *honkyoku* (original songs — used to deepen and sustain contemplative states). Shakuhachi meditation is called *suizen* (blowing meditation).
