The Power of Yes

In this liminal time, there are so many reasons to not say yes.

Even the small yeses in our daily lives feel riskier somehow. Decisions about where we put our money, our time, our energy, our confidence, and our faith feel more important than ever during these volatile times. We come from a history of people who said yes. Throughout the story of the people of God, brave and faithful, everyday people said yes to God. In Advent, these yeses are even more significant.

What does it take to get to yes? Why does it matter? Why does it matter that we believe this? This is a story that we tell, that isn't just on a page or in ancient tales, but one that lives in our bones, and calls to us to say our own yes when we are called into what God is doing now.

Today, we focus on the story of how Elizabeth and Zechariah said "Yes!"

Elizabeth and Zechariah show the range of responses to the surprising news of God's in-breaking. Some yeses, like Elizabeth's, are immediate. Others like Zechariah's, are more gradual and unfold through silence, reflection, and struggle. Both, in their own way, nevertheless, are part of God's unfolding work.
