Worship Notes

Worship Note: Several of this morning's musical works are grounded in 20th century compositional techniques which are rarely heard at St. Matthews. Well respected Czech organist and composer Petr Eben wrote the set of preludes based on Bohemian chorale melodies at the request of the Barenreiter publishing house. The tune "Sonne der Gerechtigkeit" appears twice in Evangelical Lutheran Worship and I have chosen the text at hymn #657 as our title this morning. The violin solo is taken from Concerto in C, Op. 48 by Dimitri Kabalevsky and the postlude is from the piano syllabus of the Royal Conservatory of Music, adapted to the organ. These works offer surprising juxtapositions and harmonies that may be odd in our ears. We lift them to God in respect for the diversity of God's musical landscape.
